

HB1032 (Comprehensive Human Sexuality Education) — The bill clarifies content requirements for public schools that offer comprehensive human sexuality education and prohibits such practices as using shame-based or stigmatizing language or instructional tools or excluding the health needs of lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender individuals. The bill also amends certain provisions of a pre-existing voluntary grant program for comprehensive human sexuality education and sets aside an annual appropriation of \$1 million to support the program moving forward. Schools that do not wish to teach “comprehensive human sexuality education” as outlined in the bill do not have to provide human sexuality education at all, and as amended in the Senate on the second-to-last day of session, charter schools retain the right to seek a waiver from this section of statute if they choose.
